INFORMATION SHEET

Chisholm Catholic College will offer music scholarships for students entering Year 7 in 2022.

1. The Scholarships

The Director of Music, with the discretion of the Principal, awards four Music Scholarships at the commencement of each year. Following the successful acceptance of application (via the appropriate form available from the enrolment registrar and **submitted by Wednesday, 5 March 2021**) prospective candidates are invited for audition and interview. Successful awardees are notified in writing following the conclusion of the process. Auditions will occur in **Terms 3 and 4**.

2. Audition Requirements

- Performance:
 - 1. Scales Major and Minor up to two sharps and two flats
 - 2. Two contrasting music items;
 - 3. Sight Reading Test
- Theory of Music Test (AMEB Grade 2 3 standard)

3. Application Requirements

- □ Applications are invited from parents of students who have a classical or contemporary background in music.
- □ The successful applicants will be required to participate in any of the College's music activities as deemed necessary by the Director of Music.
- □ Successful applicants will receive individual lessons on their instrument for the duration of their time at Chisholm College.
- □ Successful applicants will be required to participate in the music courses and ensembles as decided by the Director of Music and elect as part of their studies in future years the following;
- □ Year 7 Band an extra-curricular which will be held one afternoon per week.
- □ Year 8 Music Studies and Performance class as part of their timetabled classes.
- □ Year 9 Music Studies and Performance Course 1 as part of their timetabled classes.
- □ Year 10 Music Studies and Performance Course 1 as part of their timetabled classes.
- Music in Years 11 and 12 consists of five periods per week and all levels of study as required by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority for Music are met.
- □ In addition to the above, the successful applicants will need:
 - i. a positive commitment to their academic studies;
 - ii. a positive attitude to the ethos of Chisholm Catholic College;
 - iii. an appropriate behaviour record; and
 - iv. an excellent attendance record.

4. **Process of Awarding Scholarships**

- □ The Principal, along with the Director of Music, will make the final decision based on the results of the audition, examination and interview and no correspondence will be entered into.
- □ The College reserves the right to decide whether a scholarship will be awarded.
