COVID-19 LEARNING CONTINUITY

As you are already aware, members of our College community who have tested positive for COVID-19 or been identified as close contacts are required to isolate as per advice from WA Department of Health.

In order to minimise disruption to students' teaching and learning, Chisholm Catholic College is conscious of providing students who are required to isolate with continuity to their academic studies. The College is prepared for continued delivery of our teaching and learning programs, and will operate a Face-to-Face and Hybrid/Remote model.

Assuming students are not unwell, they will be expected to access the available lesson instructions and resources on SEQTA Learn and communicate with the teacher when required. If the teacher is conducting an online Teams lesson, the student is welcome to join and be supported by the teacher when they can, but the teacher's primary responsibility will be to those students in the classroom.

A student who misses an assessment because of COVID-19 isolation will not be penalised. As per our College Assessment Plan, the student will be expected to complete the assessment on their return (unless an extended period of time has elapsed), and the subject teacher, in consultation with the Head of Learning Area, may assign a standardised score.

We encourage all students to try and maintain a daily routine that supports their learning, to be organised, to continue to communicate with their respective subject teacher and to exercise safe health practices.
